The Red Zone, Defined


The Red Zone is...

a period from the beginning of orientation till the start of winter break when over 50% of campus sexual assaults occur, with particular risk from the start of move-in to the beginning of Thanksgiving break.

- 1 Observe the situation.
- take a breath
- 2 Assess the situation for safety.
 - take a breath
- 3 Which strategy you'll use: Direct, Delegate, Distract, or Delay?
 - take a breath
- 4 Act.





The Fifth D



Document

Documenting is a fifth option to consider. If you choose to document, the best case is to provide the video and/or images to the victim and let them decide what to do with the media.









